DEACON'S GREETING

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH - The Manger

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd candles are relit.

<u>DEACON</u>: A manger is a few pieces of wood nailed together to serve a good purpose. Just a set of wooden arms strong enough to hold a new bundle of hay each day. A manger protects the hay, keeps it clean and dry and away from the mice. A manger stands guard to offer its food to the animals who rely it. The manger welcomes the hungry who gather round it trusting that it holds what they need.

<u>All</u>: But how can the manger become more than what it is used to being? Is it possible that it might become something else to welcome a more precious gift even than food? When might a manger become a cradle for new life? Might it be when the loving hands of weary parents lay the newborn baby in it, hands ready to tend this precious new life? And what of the tiny hands reaching up out of the cradle for warmth and love?

<u>DEACON</u>: A manger needs a person to imagine it as a cradle, to smooth out the hay and layer on the blankets. This entire moment needs a person to stroke the tiny forehead, snuggling the newborn in loving arms. A manger remains a manger unless someone, this precious baby's parents, place its tiny form in this most unusual place.

<u>All</u>: O God, may our lives cradle your love made flesh on Christmas morning as we behold the Baby Jesus. May our love for you inspire us to become shelter for those in need of hope and new beginnings. May our hands offer welcome to the stranger, in the name of the Christ Child who reaches out to us from the manger. The 4th candle is lit.

<u>All</u>: We light the fourth candle of the Advent wreath to remember the manger and the loving parents who recognized its potential to provide rest and shelter to

the newborn Christ Child. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness does not overcome it.

### THE READINGS

### 1st Lesson – Genesis 1:1-5, 26; 31; 2:1-3

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness.
