

"Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:18-19a

Personally, I have always thought these words from the Prophet Isaiah (3rd Isaiah actually but that's a story for another time) are some of the most exciting words in Scripture. They speak to one of the most elemental truths about our God - that God is always doing a new thing in our midst. That can be difficult to accept in these days when it feels like our country and everything we have counted on for all of our lives is being attacked from within. Yet, I believe it is even *more* true now than we might think. It is precisely in moments of upheaval that God reminds us that God is always in charge, always in the middle of things, always there to remind us we are not alone. God is already to show us a new way forward even when we worry there is no way.

Isaiah is not the only one of the prophets to address these worries of course. The story of Queen Esther is another powerful example of a moment when it felt like bad things were being planned for good people and yet, still, God prevailed through the most unlikely of sources — a young Jewish woman married to a king who had no idea she was a Hebrew. She found the courage to come to her husband and aid him in understanding just what was happening and her people were saved from annihilation as a result. With God all things are possible.

I'm talking about these new things always possible with God as a way of highlighting a few important matters now on our horizon as a church. Here they are:

➤ The format of this digital *Beacon* is decidedly different from what we're used to. Key information is readily visible and detailed articles are now accessible by link. Jerin has come up with this design to address Google's concerns about the length of the old format. We are hoping this new

format is user friendly, *HOWEVER*, if you find this format to be lacking, just let Jerin know by return email and she will keep working hard to find a format that folks find acceptable. As always, hard copies are available at the church.

- The Threshold Retreat 2.0 is coming up next weekend, Saturday, February 15 from 9am to 3pm at the church. Thank you for your pledges for 2025!

Each month, this column will highlight timely special collections of the

United Church of Christ and our own Mission Committee.

One of UCC's "Five for Five" offerings is usually collected in January. If you use offering envelopes, you will find one dedicated to "Yearly Per Capita Dues for the Southern New England Conference of the United Church of Christ" (SNEC UCC). The official UCC name for this offering is "Our Church's Wider Mission," but at some point, our own church leadership

decided to make this a Per Capita Dues, as it is hoped by the UCC that each member contribute to this fund. The Per Capita Dues are used to support local youth programs, pastor training and education, and the work that helps our local SNEC UCC churches support one another, such as maintaining a substitute pastor supply and promoting ethical practices. Of the five UCC offerings, this one is the most "close to home."

Since less than half of our members use envelopes to make offerings, I like to make us all aware of this "first of five offerings." The suggested donation is \$20.00 per member. Of course this is voluntary, but our church does make up the difference to SNEC UCC in order to equal \$20.00 per member. By paying your own Per Capita Dues, it helps our church save some funds.

If you so choose, you may also make a \$12.00 offering to support our church newsletter, The Beacon. Most of us now receive this via email, however, many of our older members still receive The Beacon by post. Your donation will help pay for the copy paper, ink, and postage required to print The Beacon for our at-home members. Copies are also made for guests to pick up while attending worship. I know we all enjoy reading the news of our church, Reverend Ruth's monthly spiritual message, and being able to plan along with the calendar. Consider a Beacon donation to support this communication and outreach.

Once again, thank you all for your generous financial support of our church- whether it's on-site, local, national, or international! What we share makes a difference!
